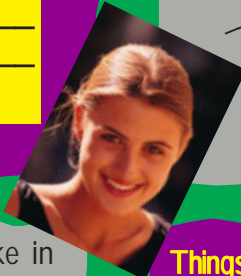

Paul Revere

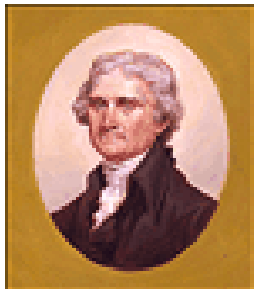


Third president of the U.S. (He was a planter and lawyer. He lived at Monticello, and liked architecture and science.

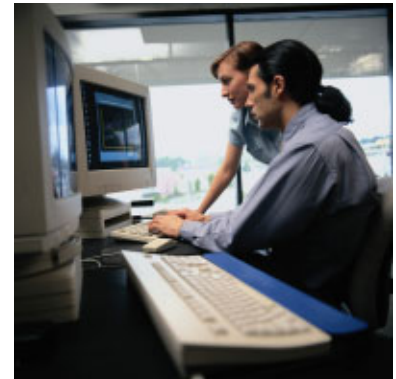


Silversmith
